Requirement Checklist and Notes

To ensure graduation, each box must be checked as completed.

You must fulfill the degree requirements for the year that you entered your current program/stream. This Advising Worksheet is meant for students who began the Cinema & Media Arts BA in Fall/Winter 2022-2023.

6.0 credits from the FA 1900 series of courses outside the major must be completed. (For students admitted to AMPD with 54.0 or more transfer credits this requirement is optional.)

Overall Grade Point Average must be at least 4.0 (C).

Major Grade Point Average must be at least 4.0 (C).

Upper-level Requirement: At least 18.0 credits must be at the 3000 or 4000 level, including at least 12.0 credits in the major.

Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30.0 course credits and at least 50% of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program (major and/or minor) must be taken at York University.

Note on the General Education Requirement: Six credits in each of the general areas of the Humanities, the Social Sciences, and the Natural Sciences must be completed within the first 90 credits. Courses must be selected from the following subject areas:
