**The General Education requirement must be satisfied by completing courses from three areas: six credits in Humanities, six credits in Natural Science, and six credits in Social Science. Courses to satisfy these requirements may be chosen from the table on Page 2 of this worksheet. Please note:

6.0 credits in Humanities are satisfied by courses from the FA 1900 series outside the major: **FA/ARTH 1900 3.0, FA/CMA 1900 3.0, FA/DANC 1900 3.0, FA/MUSI 1900 3.0, FA/PANF 1900 3.0, FA/THEA 1900 3.0.**

^6.0 credits in AP/COMN (AP/CMDS) or SC/STS can be used to satisfy the 6.0 credit Social Science requirement. However, Art History (FA/ARTH) courses can NOT be used towards the Social Science requirement.

*****IN/OUTS AMPD Electives** may be chosen from the following subject areas: Art History (FA/ARTH), Dance (FA/DANC), Design (FA/DESN), Film/Cinema & Media Arts (FA/FILM or FA/CMA), Music (FA/MUSI), Interdisciplinary Fine Arts (FA/PANF), Theatre (FA/THEA), Visual Arts (FA/VISA).

Requirement Checklist and Notes

To ensure graduation, each box must be checked as completed.

You must fulfill the degree requirements for the year that you entered your current program/stream. This Advising Worksheet is meant for students who began the Digital Media (Digital Media Game Arts) Spec. Hons. BA in Fall/Winter 2022-2023.

6.0 credits from the FA 1900 series of courses outside the major must be completed. (For students admitted to AMPD with 54.0 or more transfer credits this requirement is optional.)

6.0 credits from the Social Science General Education requirement must be completed. 6.0 credits from AP/COMN (AP/CMD5) or SC/STS at the 3000/4000 level may count towards this requirement.

Overall Grade Point Average must be at least 5.0 (C+).

Major Grade Point Average must be at least 5.0 (C+).

Upper-level Requirement: A minimum of 36.0 credits must be at the 3000 or 4000 level. Of these, at least 18.0 credits must be at the 4000 level.

Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30.0 course credits and at least 50% of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program (major and/or minor) must be taken at York University.

Note on the General Education Requirement: Six credits in each of the general areas of the Humanities, the Social Sciences, and the Natural Sciences must be completed within the first 90 credits. Courses must be selected from the following subject areas:

School of the Arts, Media, Performance & Design students may satisfy the Humanities General Education requirement by taking six credits from the FA 1900 series of courses outside the major. However, these courses, if used to satisfy the Humanities General Education requirement, cannot also be counted in another category.

For Digital Media Spec. Hons. BA students, 6.0 AP/COMN (AP/CMD5) or SC/STS credits at the 3000 or 4000 level may be used to satisfy the Social Science requirement.
