

Requirement Checklist and Notes

To ensure graduation, each box must be checked as completed.

You must fulfill the degree requirements for the year that you entered your current program/stream. This Advising Worksheet is meant for students who began the Integrative Arts Spec. Hons. BFA in Fall/Winter 2024-2025.

6.0 credits from the FA 1900 series of courses outside the major must be completed. (For students admitted to AMPD with 54.0 or more transfer credits this requirement is optional.)

Overall Grade Point Average must be at least 5.0 (C+).

Major Grade Point Average must be at least 5.0 (C+).

Upper-level Requirement: Of the 33.0 studio and 21.0 studies credits required of the major, 18.0 credits must be at the 3000 level.

Upper-level Requirement Continued: Of the 33.0 studio and 21.0 studies credits required of the major, 18.0 credits must be at the 4000 level. At least 6.0 credits at the 4000 level must be from one area (Cinema and Media Arts, Computational Arts, Dance, Music, Theatre, or Visual Art and Art History) – excluding core courses.

Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30.0 course credits and at least 50% of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program (major and/or minor) must be taken at York University.

Note on the General Education Requirement: Six credits in each of the general areas of the Humanities, the Social Sciences, and the Natural Sciences must be completed within the first 90 credits. Courses must be selected from the following subject areas:

However, these courses, if used to satisfy the Humanities General Education requirement, cannot also be counted in another category.
